This four-year plan is a suggested curriculum to complete this degree program in four years. It is just one of several plans that will work and is presented only as broad guidance to students. Each student is strongly encouraged to develop a customized plan in consultation with their academic advisor. Additional information can also be found in Degree Works. Foreign Language proficiency through 202 level in French, German, Italian, Latin or Spanish needed; proficiency is not met by completion of ASdegree.

Requirements for graduation include a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 overall and in the major, a grade of Cor better in all courses required for the major, including prerequisite courses, 120 credit hours, which must include both a minimum of 30 credit hours overall and 12 credit hours in upper-level courses in the major program from Old Dominion University, completion of ENGL110C, ENGL211Cor 221Cor 231C, and a writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of Cor better, and completion of Senior Assessment.

NOTE. Students pursuing graduate work leading to teaching, museology, art citicism or dealing in works of art will be counseled on course selection. For students considering graduate work in art history, 18 hours of German or French are strongly recommended. Students who wish to distinguish themselves in the major may opt for the thesis elective, ARTH 480, in their final year of study.
